Ufford-Chase founded BorderLinks, a bi-national organization that connects and educates people of faith on both sides of the United States/Mexico border. He has worked with the Evangelical Center for Pastoral Studies in Central America in Guatemala and has been a co-moderator of Presbyterian Peace Fellowship. Currently, Ufford-Chase and his wife, Kitty, serve as transitional co-directors of Stony Point Center in New York.</p> <p>Hudson River Presbytery recently decided to give the property of the former Stony Point Church, a congregation in the town of Stony Point, dissolved in 2018, to support the Sweetwater Cultural Center, a project being developed by the Ramapough Lunape Nation that includes a native people's mission to the United Nations, an example of Stony Point's mission partnership approach. REPORT OF THE BUDGET AND FINANCE TEAM

ACTION ITEMS

MOTION: The Budget and Finance Team recommends that the Presbytery make no change in the Presbytery Per Capita rate for 2021. The Per Capita rate breakout is as follows: General Assembly \$8.98 (increase of 3 cents from 2020), Synod of Lakes of Prairies \$5.40 (no increase from 2020), Presbytery of East Iowa \$23.65 (no increase from 2020). CAMP WYOMING REPORT

1. We have nominated the following individuals for the Camp Wyoming Board of Trustees:
 - Bill Brause – Bill is a member of First Presbyterian Church in Cedar Rapids. He is the Assistant Director of Physical Plant/Coordinator of Sustainability at Coe College.
 - Misti Huedepohl – Misti is a member of First Presbyterian Church near Ely. She is the Communications Manager for Whirlpool Corporation in Amana, Iowa.
 - Phil Gilkerson – Phil is a member of First Presbyterian Church in Monticello. He is a High School Studies Teacher. Phil is a former camper and summer staff member at Camp Wyoming.
 - Samantha Reges – Samantha grew up in Atkins, Iowa where she attended Pleasant Hill Presbyterian Church. She is the Operations Director for her family's Great Clips franchises. Samantha and her family live in Norway, Iowa and are not members of a Presbyterian church. She would fill one of the three seats on the Board for Non-Presbyterian members.
2. Camp Wyoming was awarded a \$7,500 grant from the Synod of Lakes & Prairies. The Presbytery applied for a \$10,000 grant on our behalf. We are very grateful for the Presbytery's support during this process.
3. We are very excited to share that we received a \$50,000 gift from First Presbyterian Church in Muscatine to support the camp during the COVID-19 Pandemic. We are extremely grateful for their commitment to Camp Wyoming.
4. Attached please find our Balance Sheet as of October 31, 2020. When the camp made projections in June, we anticipated that we would have a debt of \$132,000 by the end of October. As of October 31st, we had a debt of \$14,574.71 housed in our line of credit. We are in a better financial position than we projected by \$117,000. We could not be in this position without the help and support of the Presbytery of East Iowa.
5. The Camp Board decided to run our annual winter youth retreat, Wintertainment. In the past, it was a 3 day-2 night retreat. This year, we will run a 2 day-1 night retreat from December 19-20. The Board also decided to run our typical 10 week summer schedule in 2021. We have made changes to our program and operation to implement additional health and safety precautions.
6. To date, we have received \$11,765 from Presbytery of East Iowa churches towards the \$25,000 matching funds from the Presbytery towards our new High Ropes Course & Climbing Tower campaign. Please consider giving towards this wonderful new project to support the future of Camp Wyoming.

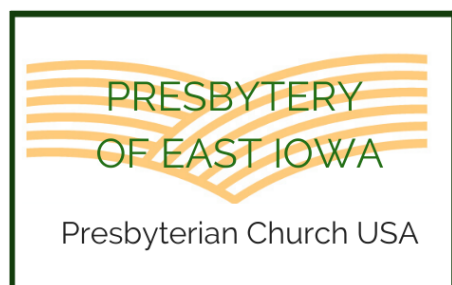

AIM NETWORK RENEWAL APPLICATION

2-YEAR REAPPLICATION FOR THE PEIA AIM NETWORK

AIM stands for Access and Inclusive Mission which was founded in Sacramento, California, by a Presbyterian Church (USA) minister, The Rev. Dr. Timothy H. Little. Reverend Little is legally blind and is a former Chaplain Supervisor of Davis Medical Center in California, now retired. He and Marcia A. Murphy began corresponding in Summer 2013; and with his guidance, Marcia, of Saint Andrew Presbyterian Church (Iowa City), established the AIM ministry at St. Andrew which was also the first in the Mid-West. As of 2014, Marcia has been the PEIA AIM moderator with connections with various churches and organizations within the Presbytery. Every two years, Marcia, as moderator, is required to re-apply for continuation of the PEIA AIM Network.

First of all, what does the AIM ministry/program promote? The focus of AIM is to increase disability awareness and inclusion for those with physical, mental, emotional, and spiritual challenges; encouraging our religious and civic communities to be welcoming places for all. Here is the AIM ministry's webpage: <https://hopeforrecovery.com/aim/> Over the years, Marcia applied for and received grant funding from the Presbytery, Synod, and regional level (the Omaha Presbyterian Seminary Foundation). In addition, the MOS committee (Mission, Outreach, and Service) of SAPC, has generously provided support.

Marcia, in recent years, has discovered that partnering with a sister ministry at St. Andrew, MHI (Mental Health Initiatives, founded in 2006 in SAPC by Marcia), has broadened the AIM ministry's scope of influence. In many respects AIM and MHI meld together with their joint focus on support for the disabled and health and wellness in body, mind, and spirit, including social inclusion within the religious community. Social support for those with physical, emotional, mental, and spiritual challenges is the bedrock in a warm and welcoming congregation.

These joint ministries promote advocacy for physically and mentally disabled persons through educational events such as workshops, presentations, and literature, as well as toward the purchase of clothing for those needing assistance at the UIHC psychiatric units in Iowa City. As a 2019 joint AIM/MHI Initiative, St. Andrew members, Marcia Murphy along with St. Andrew member, Dr. Cecilia Norris, created the UI Center for Advancement Fund for the University of Iowa Hospitals & Clinics Psychiatric Department for patients' apparel. They worked in tandem with UI Psych Dept administration and UICA to get this established and it will be on-going. The UI Psychiatric Department has expressed their gratitude to St. Andrew for this initiative.

Over the years, Marcia has given talks for UIHC medical students sharing her experience of disability and recovery process and has also written and published books with Wipf & Stock Publishers. In January, 2019, St. Andrew and the Iowa City Public Library co-sponsored an Author Event where Marcia presented and held a discussion about her book, *To Loose the Bonds of Injustice: The Plight of the Mentally Ill & What the Church Can Do* (2018). AIM/MHI, in 2020, learned of a need for winter scarves, mittens, and hats at the Iowa City Homeless Shelter. With this in mind, AIM/MHI called for all knitters and crocheters at St. Andrew and other friends to consider donating hand-made items to this initiative.

AIM has also partnered with other St. Andrew ministries for the furthering of its mission. In 2019, Heather Woodin, SAPC's Children's and Family Ministry Director, generously provided partial funding to purchase wall panels for use in the Summer 2019 AIM art exhibit which would double as items for Heather's ministry uses at other times. This (now annual) *All Abilities Celebration Art Exhibit*, held in the SAPC atrium June 17–July 8, 2019, brought together members and friends of SAPC who are both able and differently-abled who shared their artwork. See: <http://saintandrew-ic.org/mission-service/all-abilities-art-gallery> A reception for the art show was held on the day of a special St. Andrew June 23, 2019 AIM All Abilities Celebration Sunday worship (annual) service focusing on the theme of inclusivity in churches for those with physical, intellectual, emotional, and spiritual challenges. Pastor Kyle Otterbein preached an inspirational message and a video clip was shown of several St. Andrew members who described their experiences in St. Andrew as people with disability challenges. The video was generously provided by church staff person, Jeff Charis-Carlson, who conducted and taped the interviews. Saint Andrew member, Cary Maassen (someone with disability challenges), provided an excellent work of art for the cover of the All Abilities Celebration Sunday worship services bulletin.

AIM/MHI hosted a speaking event (June 22, 2019) by partnering with two staff members from the Iowa City homeless facility, Shelter House, Erin Sullivan and Rachel Lehman, presenting on the difficulties for handicapped persons when they search for housing in the Johnson county area and

related issues. There was a good turn out and a brief video can be viewed at Marcia's website:

On October 24, 2020, AIM and MHI, and MOS are co-sponsoring a Bullying Awareness Event via Zoom featuring the presenter Jamie Kremsreiter Elizalde, PhD, NCSP, Clinical Associate Professor/Licensed Psychologist, Department of Psychiatry, University of Iowa Hospitals & Clinics. It is to help listeners identify those who are bullied and suggest ways to respond in support of those who are bullied. The UI College of Education and the Mental Health Ministry of the PCUSA Office of Mental Health Ministry (Compassion, Peace and Justice Presbyterian Mission Agency), has expressed interest in either listening to it live or viewing the recording of the event later after we post it on-line. This event is being promoted for all churches at the Presbytery level, also to anyone within the surrounding school districts, and various religious organizations.

Over the years, the PEIA AIM Network has been comprised of people of all ages and all abilities from different Presbytery churches and secular institutions. In addition, people from other denominations and organizations have attended our events. A founding Network member, Mary Hubbard, Ex Officio (Formerly Specialist Librarian, CDD, UIHC), passed away January 2020. Another senior member from First Pres (Iowa City) also passed away. We still have another member from First Pres, and the group comprised of those involved with SAPC keeps growing. Because of the pandemic, Marcia maintains contact with Network members individually by phone, text, and email. Marcia hopes that in the near future, other religious communities within the Presbytery will become interested and actively involved. She is open to Presbytery leaders for suggestions on how she can take steps to spark new interest in the AIM vision.

This new development of partnering with other church ministries is an added benefit for both AIM and the other church ministries. It is to be encouraged with other Presbytery members as they begin their own AIM programs within their religious community. I have mentioned only a few things done so far in AIM; much more could be said. I place this before you for your prayerful consideration of the worthiness of a two-year renewal for the PEIA AIM Network. Thanks for your time.
