Stewardship Kaleidoscope

The Transforming Communities/Vital Leaders Committee and the Communications Committee became sponsors of the recent Stewardship Kaleidoscope in Minneapolis. Our booth invited people to imagine the future of ministry with us as well as many conversations about what the Synod is and does. Not many Synods are as active as we are!

Face to Face

In partnering with our presbyteries to help attract good pastoral leaders, the Communications Committee decided to offer a Virtual Face to Face event on November 2 for prospective candidates to meet Pastor Nominating Committees from the Synod. Over a dozen churches are participating.

Synod School

512 people attended the 69th Annual Synod School. There were special circumstances this year, namely RAGBRAI, which is short for Register's Annual Great Bicycle Ride Across Iowa, that provided challenges and opportunities. Many came a day early to help others arriving in Storm Lake with thousands of bicyclers. Lakeside Presbyterian Church invited Synod Schoolers to join them for worship on Sunday. As ever, everyone rose to the occasion to make it a wonderful week. Keynote speaker, Jimmie Hawkins proclaimed Synod School as "the Wakanda of Iowa." Plans are underway for the 70th Anniversary, July 21-26, 2024.

Education time

Corey Schlosser-Hall, Presbyterian Mission Agency's Director of Rebuilding and Vision Implementation shared in our educational presentation. He talked about the importance of imagination and ecclesial innovation. He focused his time on the passage from Acts 16:13-14 saying this is a place of imagination, possibility, and innovation in the early church. He encouraged the Synod to think about Where the intersections and connections of relationships are and what the unique contribution of the Synod is to the world which God so loves.

Restorative Actions

The Afro-American trusts have been approved by the IRS. The trustees will make the first distribution in 2023-2024. The task force is working on setting up the Indigenous trusts. 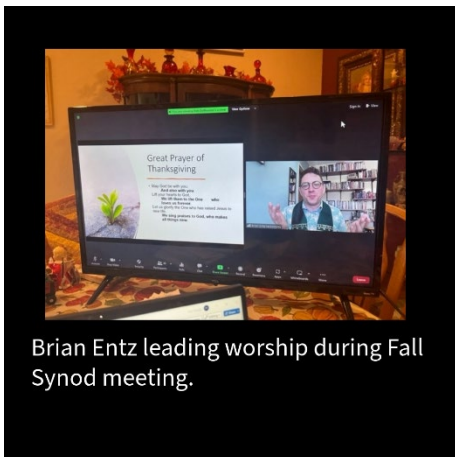
Strategic Planning
